The Club must have completed and submitted to their SKA, their <u>COVIDSafe Action Plan</u> for all facilities.

3.1.	Pit Crew with trolleys Will Not be given access to the Circuit during Qualifying and Racing.

3.3.	Pit Crew must only enter the Circuit when permitted by the Grid Marshal or the Clerk of the Course and then only if wearing a <b>HIGH VISIBILITY SAFETY VEST</b> on the upper torso.					
3.4.	Karts can be retrieved via the Ingrid/Outgrid as directed to by the officials.					
4.	ADDITIONAL VENUE REQUIREMENTS					
4.1.	Subject to any applicable laws which may govern the access of animals, including but not limited to guide dogs, no animals are allowed anywhere within the facility.

4.3.	No unlicenced driving of motor vehicles permitted at the Circuit.					
4.4.	No motorised scooters, mini bikes, roller blading, skateboards, bicycles and tricycles allowed at the complex during the entire Meeting. Officials may confiscate any such items for the duration of the Meeting.					
4.5.	Pegging of Marquees/Tents into the ground is NOT permitted anywhere on the property. There are limited tie down blocks to be used around the pit area and competitors are advised to bring their own.					
4.6.	The "Red Flag" designated area will be the INGRID unless otherwise directed by an Official.					
4.7.	Absolutely no disposing/spilling of fuels and oils anywhere on the property.					
4.8.	Absolutely no disposing of tyres anywhere on the property.					
4.9.	Social distancing rules must be observed and adhered to at all times					
4.10.	Everyone must pit in a trailer-tent-trailer-tent pattern to create a physical barrier between each pit bay.
